Dress Code Information

Reminder—it is your job to share the dress code with your guest!

1. Formal attire is required. This includes tuxedos, suits (jacket, tie, dress shirt and slacks), military dress uniforms, and formal dresses.
2. Tuxedo coats may be removed after Grand March, but the dress shirt must remain on and buttoned during prom. You may unbutton the collar, but not the entire shirt.
3. Students may ONLY wear hats that are considered formal wear—no baseball caps.
4. Shoes are required.
5. Sunglasses are NOT to be worn during grand march.
6. Piercings are prohibited when worn in any visible body part other than the ear or nose. Only small studs are allowed in the nose.

7. PROM DRESSES

- ❖ Should not be shorter than fingertip length. This includes the slits in dresses.
- ❖ Should not be too low cut in the back. Your bottom should not show at any time during prom, whether you are standing, walking, sitting, dancing, leaning, etc;
- ❖ Should not reveal cleavage. No plunging necklines allowed.
- ❖ Should not have sheer, skin-toned fabric that gives the illusion of bare skin in areas that should not be bare.
- ❖ 2 piece dresses may only reveal 2 inches of skin or less, in the midriff area.

Please be responsible when choosing your dress for PROM. If you arrive and your dress is not appropriate you will be asked to leave and not return until you have corrected attire. If you have a question about the dress you might choose, please bring a picture and ask a principal. Do not risk being sent home from prom.

Students and their parents are expected to use good judgment and remember that this is a HIGH SCHOOL event when selecting appropriate prom attire.
